A form of communication that uses different content forms into a single interactive experience.

**Multimedia**

A type of multimedia that include links to navigate between different types of media. Also is an extension of hypertext.

**Hypermedia**

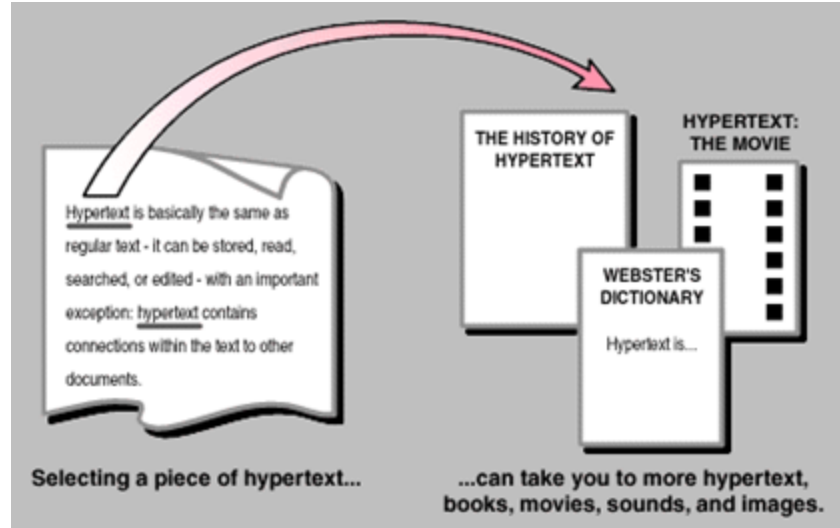
A software system that links topics to related information using a point-click method.

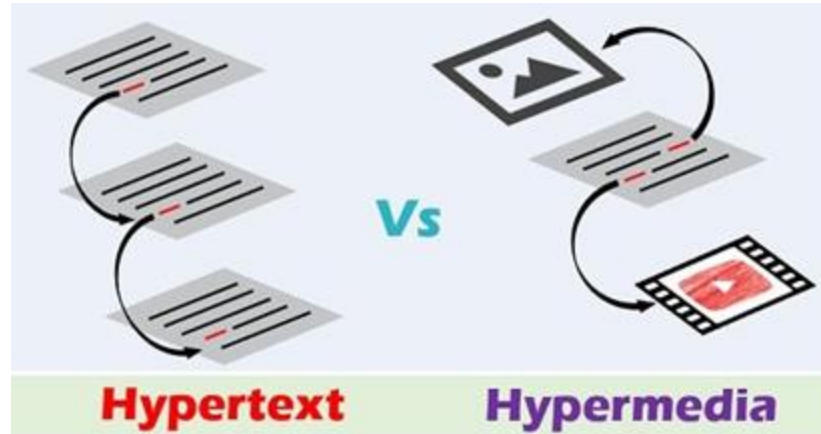

# Wikipedia on Hypermedia

Most hypermedia is delivered through electronic pages and systems such as web browsers. Which differs from multimedia that has the absence of hyperlinks.



An extension of hypertext that adds graphics, audio, and video.

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Hardware, software, and connection speed all had to improve in order for hypermedia to be possible.

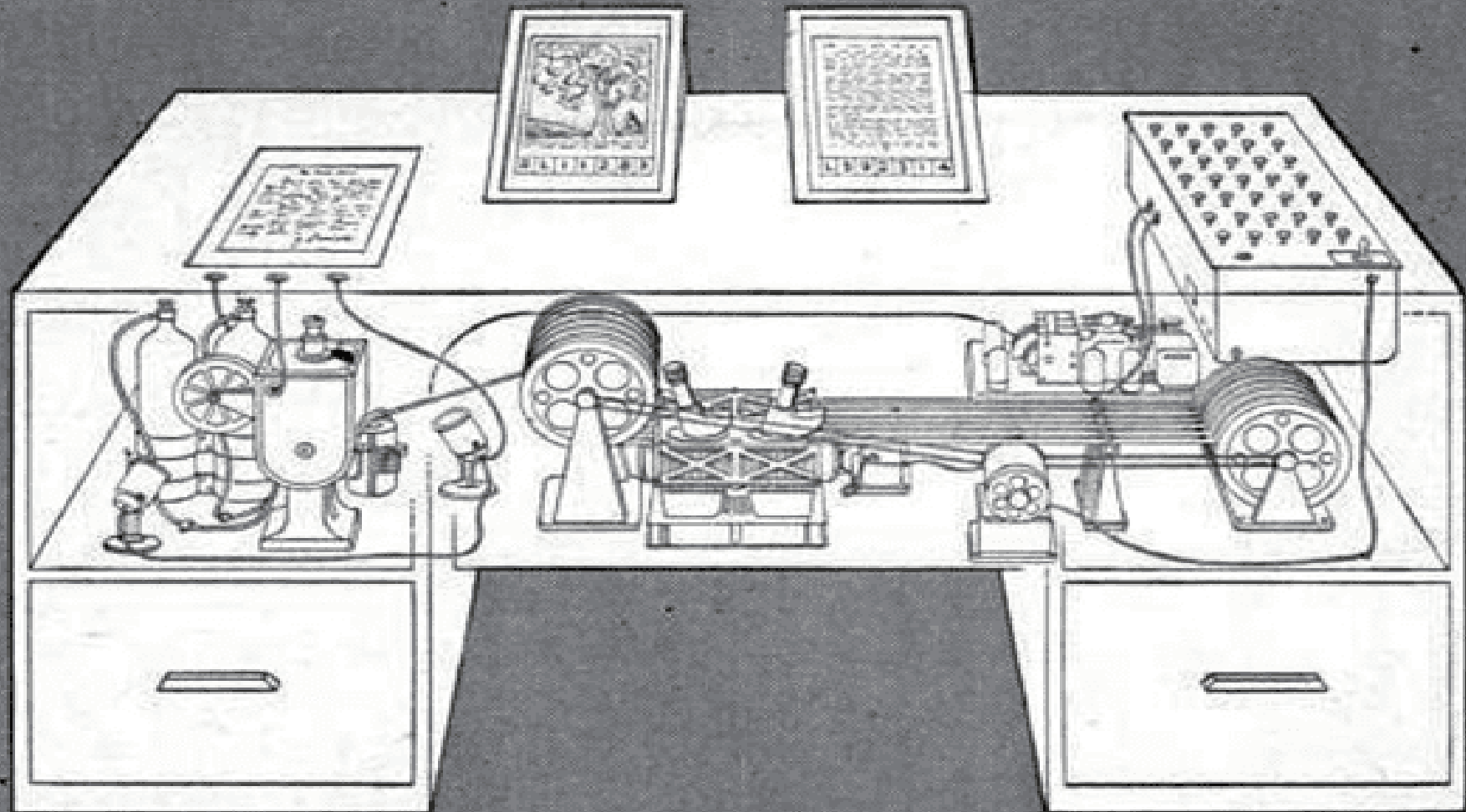
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# Vannevar Bush's idea: MEMEX



- ❑ First idea in 1939 about a file and library system that later on would be the format of Hypertext (which was first used in an article by Ted Nelson).
- ❑ Inspired by rapid and accessible knowledge.
- ❑ Created the image of a system for storing and retrieving data in a orderly manner. Calling it “memex” from the combination of the words memory and extender.



# Gopher

A communication system that was text only designed for sharing, searching, and retrieving informational documents.



# Aspen Movie Map

- ❑ Arguably it is the first form of multimedia.
- ❑ Early hypermedia project produced in 1978-79 at MIT.
- ❑ Virtual tour of Aspen, Colorado.
- ❑ Department of Defense was interested in the movie map because of its military potential!

# HyperCard

A software application and development kit that combines a flat-file database (hence the name card) with graphical and modifiable interfaces.



# HTML: Hypertext Markup Language

Is the basic language and building block in building a web page, especially hyperlinks.

Defines the structure of the web page.

Uses this structure or known as “markups” in order to annotate any kind of text or image using special elements.

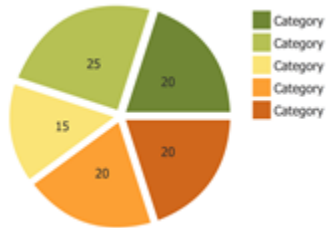
## Images

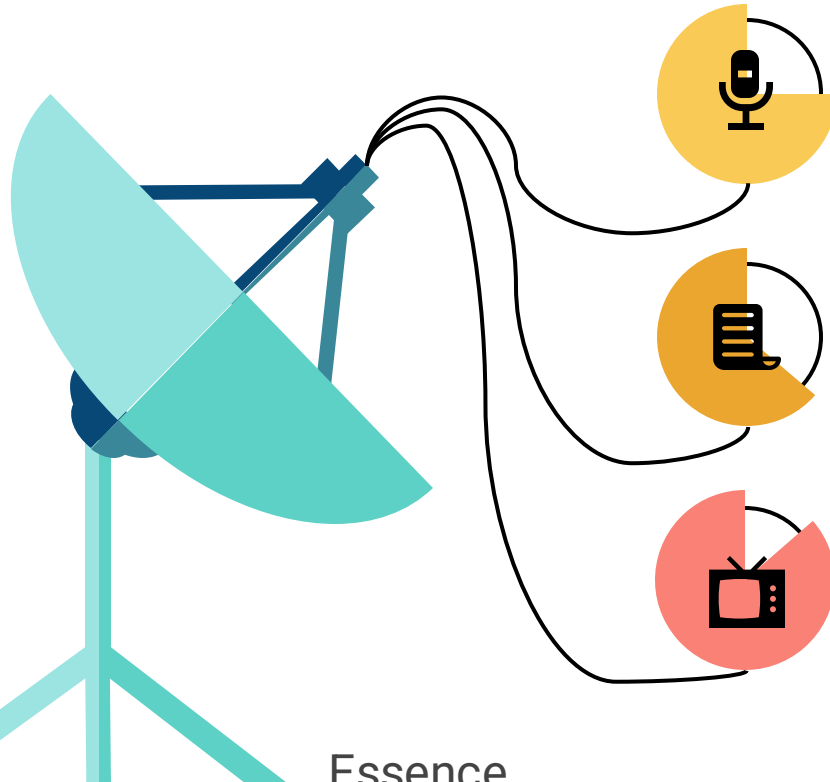

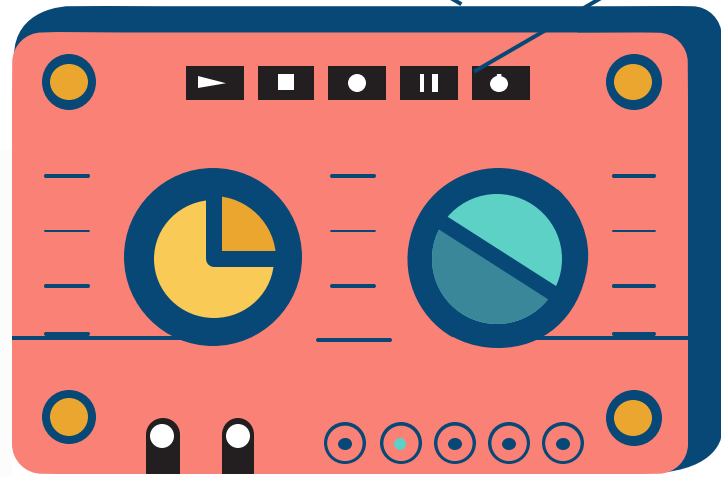
# SONY's Walkman

Gravestones, artifacts, museums as a whole

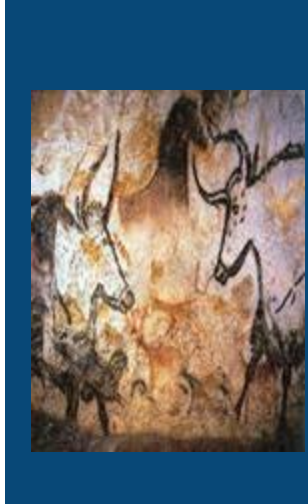
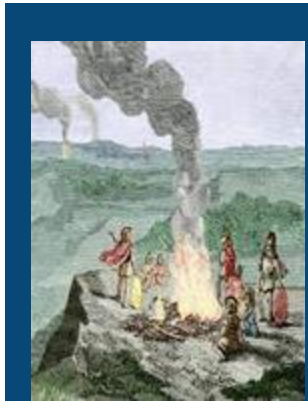
## Audio

Includes radio, music, podcasts

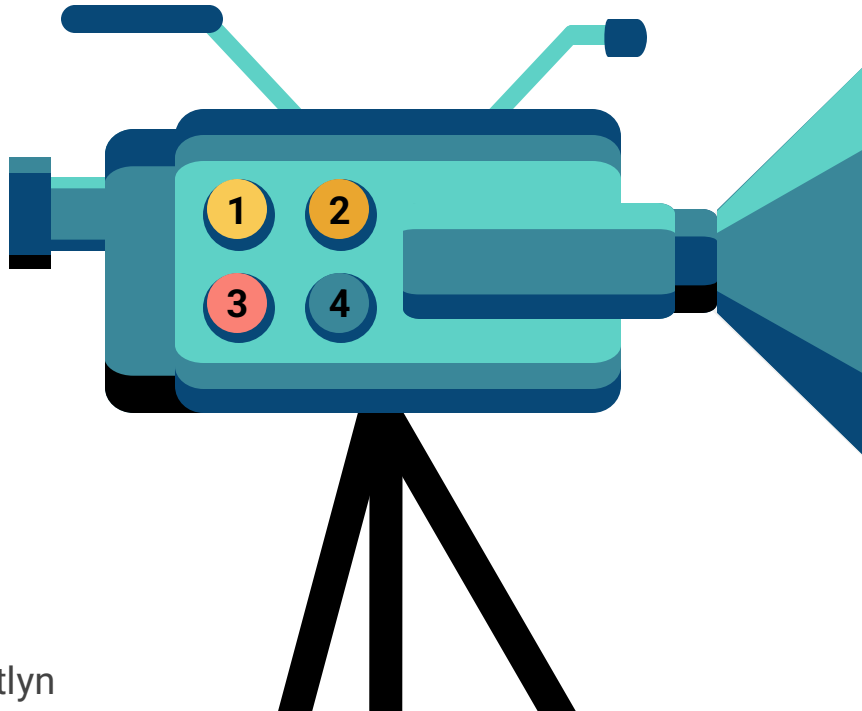
## Visual

**Chalkboard:** a blackboard (or green board in some cases) that was used in many classrooms from 1801 to the 1970s

**Mimeograph:** a machine that makes copies of something using a stencil and ink, paper is fed into it

**Punched Card:** a piece of paper that is fed into a machine where holes are punched into it that store data

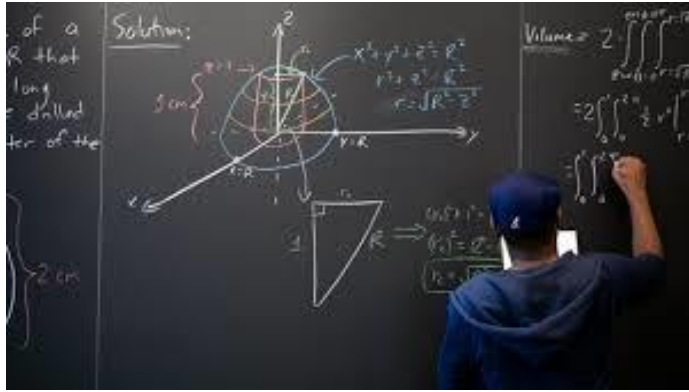

**Opaque Projectors:** a device that projects a bigger image onto a screen; shines a bright light down, prism reflects it

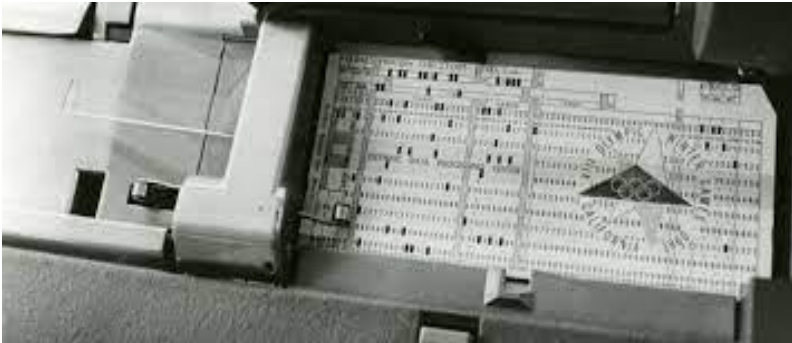

# More Media in the Classroom



**Overhead Projectors:** a piece of paper is placed on top of the projector and light is projected from underneath and a mirror reflects the contents of the paper onto a screen

**Slide Projectors:** a device that uses the same types of lights and prisms but projects slide disks instead of paper

**LCD Projectors:** a newer type of projector that projects images and videos from a computer or other smart devices using cables, bluetooth, or wifi

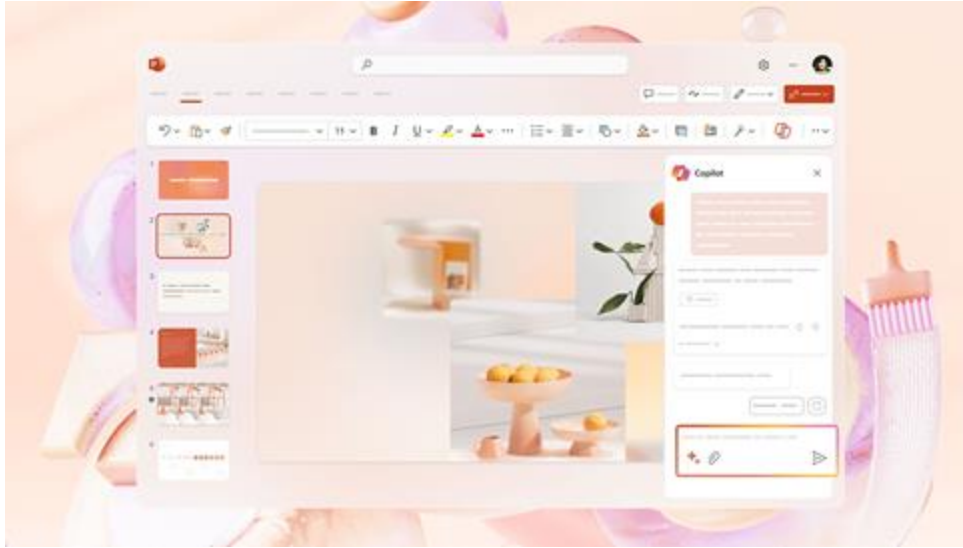
