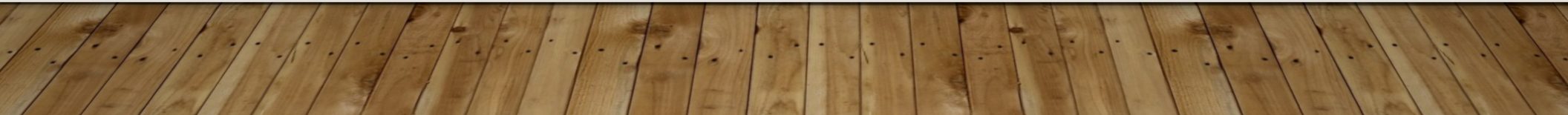

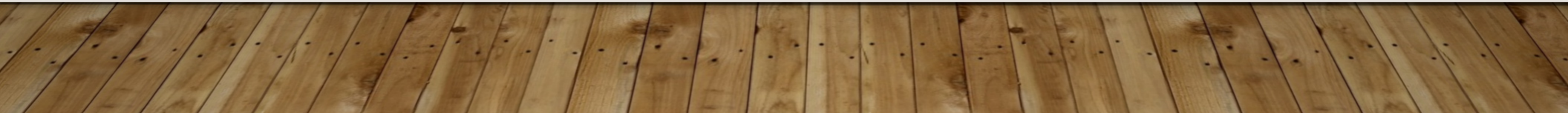

PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES VS. PRIVATE UNIVERSITIES

- Receives most of money from government funding
- Under supervision of local, state, regional, and federal governing and accrediting agencies
- Set their own tuition rates and fees
- Has out-of-state and in-state tuition
- Not publicly funded (no government funding)
- Still must adhere to accreditation standards
- Have more liberty to run school as seen fit

- publicly funded
- larger
↳ class size
- more affordable

Private
- privately funded
- smaller
↳ class size
- more expensive

COLLEGES: PUBLIC VS. PRIVATE



NONPROFIT VS. FOR-PROFIT

- Operate as business ventures
- Aims to make money for shareholders and provide good education
- Generate significant controversy
 - Critics calling for stricter regulations to ensure good investment return

ETHNIC MINORITY

- Attract students who like the idea of attending a college with others of the same ethnic and cultural background
- Large percentage of one minority
- Large percentage of minority professors

CHURCH AFFILIATED

- Private institutions (separation of church and state)
- No public funding
- Rely on money from student fees and denomination, and alumni
- Students often required to attend religious classes or courses



SINGLE GENDER

- Women only Universities are designed for more opportunities in leadership roles
- Learn without distraction or intimidation of other sex
