- Receives Government Funds
- Higher Acceptance Rates



Private

- Can be Affiliated with a Religious Group
- Higher Tuition Rates



Carnegie Classifications

- Basic Categories Include:
 - Doctoral Universities
 - Master's Colleges & Universities
 - Baccalaureate Colleges
 - Baccalaureate/Associate's Colleges
 - Associate's Colleges
 - Special Focus Institutions
 - Tribal Colleges







Doctoral Universities

- Awarded at least 20 research/scholarship doctoral degrees
- Awarded less than 20
 research/scholarship but awarded at
 least 30 professional practice doctoral
 degrees in at least 2 programs







Master's Colleges and Universities


Award at least 50 master's degrees and fewer than 20 doctoral degrees

Baccalaureate Colleges

 At least 50% of all degrees are baccalaureate degrees but fewer than 50 master's degrees or 20 doctoral degrees







Baccalaureate/Associate's Colleges

Offer at least one four-year degree program, but have more than 50% of associate's degrees







Where Students Come First!

Associate's Colleges

Offer associate's degrees as the highest degree

 Have a high concentration of degrees in a single field.
