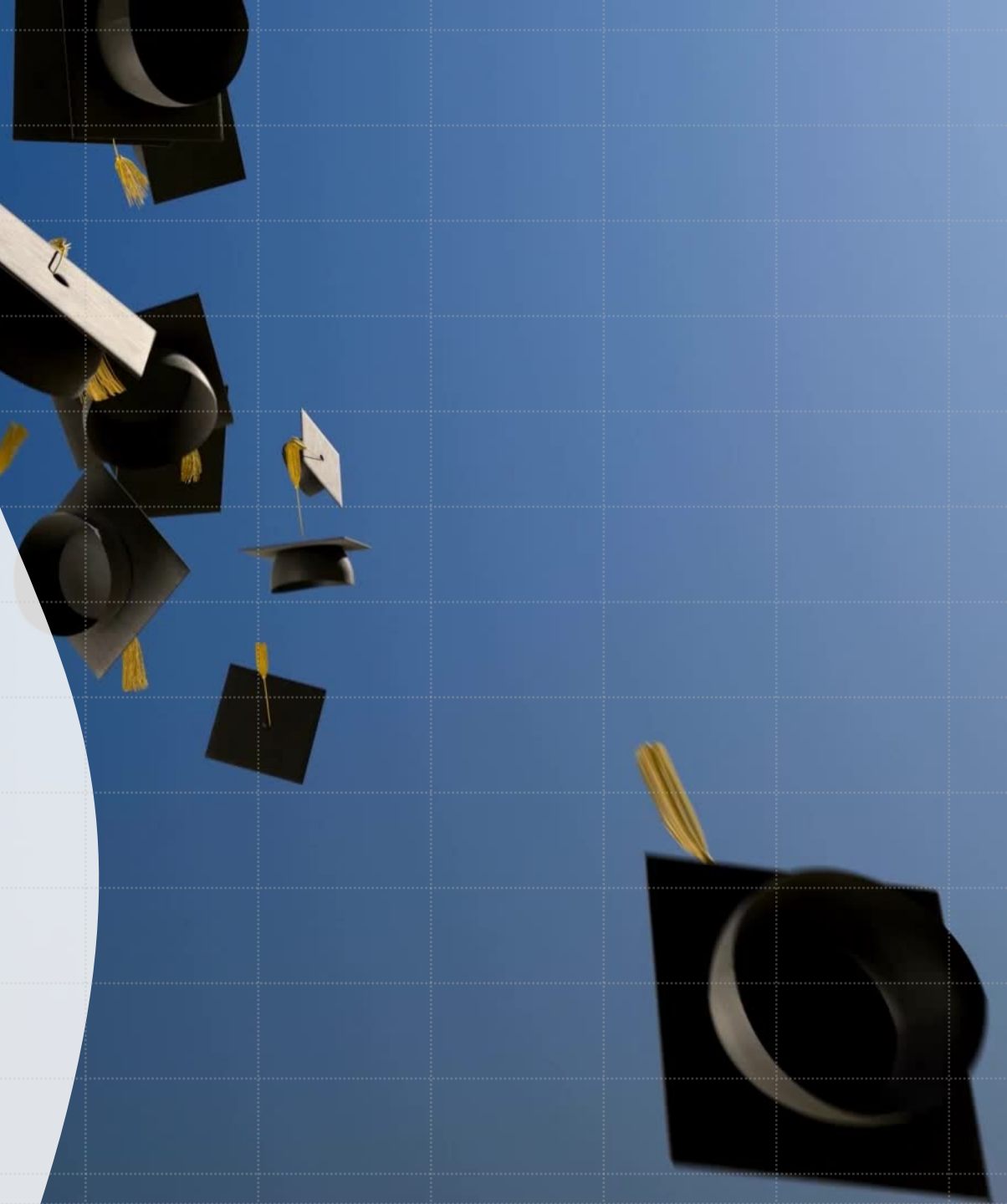

# What is Honors?

- Honors is divided into two general categories; Colleges and Programs
- Offers additional courses and scholarships
- Lower acceptance rate than normal colleges
- Much higher standards than average
- Higher Grad School acceptance rates compared to other College undergrads



# Honors College



TYPICALLY A SMALLER COLLEGE  
WITHIN A UNIVERSITY



ALLOWS FOR SMALLER, MORE  
EXCLUSIVE CLASSES



MORE PROFESSOR INTERACTION  
THAN STANDARD COURSES

# Honors Program



Usually not directly affiliated with a University, can be enrolled in from anywhere



Little to no difference in difficulty compared to Honors Colleges



Depending on the University, there can be no difference between course load or benefits



# Major Differences

## College

- Head must be a Dean
- Individual control over admissions
- Controls their own policies within the school
- More courses and variations of the same courses (ex: Calculus II-H)

## Program

- Does not require the head to be a dean
- Only controls admissions into their program
- Only controls policies in their program
- Is typically extramural
- More limited course availability
