

# Benefits for Honors College

- Pros:
- Students get to attend smaller classes with more attention for each student.
- ✓ Honors credentials can help students have a higher chance to get into graduate school or medical school.
- ✓ Faculty gives more attention to honor students.

- Cons:
- ✓ Honor students will be affected if the university must make a budget cut.
- ✓ Honor students must share resources like the library with the other student body of the university.
- ✓ Honor students might be considered special and treated in the wrong way. For example, some universities will not want to have a "better class" in the student body.

#### How Many Honors Education programs are in Arkansas?

- There are 11 NCHC recognized honors programs in Arkansas Universities.
- The 4 we are discussing are
   Southern Arkansas University,
   University of Central Arkansas,
   Arkansas State University, and
   Arkansas Tech University.









#### **Application Process**

Each Arkansas University Honors program
has a different process, some have more
steps than others, and some are more
competitive than others. They typically
consist of a required ACT score and/or GPA
and a secondary application or essay.



## Southern Arkansas University

- Admission and Graduation Requirement:
- Looks at high school GPA, ACT or SAT scores (incoming freshman)
- For current SAU students, students with a 3.5 GPA or higher can apply for honors college
- Students transferring from 2+2 program must hold a minimum GPA of 3.25 and must submit an online application, essays, and letters of recommendation like incoming freshman
- To graduate with honors students must have 24 honors hours courses (3 honor hours a semester) and keep a
   3.25 GPA to remain in Honors College

- Incentives:
- \$300 each semester, honors hall, early registration, free trips, and designation for honors graduation on transcript and diploma

## University of Central Arkansas

- Admission and Graduation Requirement:
- GPA either high school or college at least 3.5; no minimum ACT
- To graduate students must have 15 hours of 3000-level and 4000-level courses in Honors College

#### Incentives:

\* \$2,000/ Semester Stipend,

Private Room Upgrade

Scholarship

#### Arkansas State University Honors College

- Admissions Criteria and Graduation Requirements
  - A minimum requirement of a 28 composite on the ACT AND a High School GPA of 3.50 or higher. (Incoming Freshmen)
  - \* 18 college credit hours, 3.25 cumulative GPA and a recommendation from a faculty member or advisor. Also, a separate application. (Transfer students and current ASU Students)
  - Graduation requirements have different options, the highest honors requires 24 honors credit hours, 12 upper level, a senior thesis and a GPA of 3.5 or higher.

- Incentives or Perks
  - Many scholarships that require secondary applications, starting at a \$500 per semester value.
  - Opportunities to Study abroad along side peers.
  - LLC- a smart classroom building and multiple housing options.

## Arkansas Tech University Honors College

- Admissions Criteria and Graduation Requirements
  - For University Honors application, an applicant must have Early Admission to Tech, which is based on an ACT score of 27 or higher or being in the top 10% of your graduation class, and a GPA of 3.5, and then they must complete a prompted Essay portion to finish applying.
  - There is an interview portion as well.
  - To graduate with honors students must complete 21 honors hours, which are laid out in the course catalog as curriculum. This includes mentorship and Senior project.

- Incentives or Perks
  - ❖ A \$2,000 dollar scholarship
  - Volunteer Service opportunities.
