Southern Arkansas University



- Southern Arkansas University was established in 1901 in Magnolia, Arkansas.
- There are currently 4,138 students enrolled at SAU.
- Southern Arkansas offers 70 undergraduate programs and 19 graduate programs.
- Popular programs at SAU include business, nursing, and a newly founded game design and engineering.
- The mascot is a mulerider and they are in the Great American Conference in Division II of the NCAA.
- Famous graduates of Southern Arkansas include:
 - Tracy Lawrence, famous country singer
 - Jordan Babnieaux, former NFL player

University of Arkansas



- The University of Arkansas was founded in 1871 in Fayetteville, Arkansas.
- There is currently 26,754 students enrolled at U of A.
- They offer 78 undergraduate majors, 86 master degrees, and 50 doctoral and specialist programs.
- Their most popular programs include architecture, agriculture, business, communication disorders, history, and law.
- Their mascot is a razorback, and they compete in the Southeastern Conference in Division I of the NCAA.

University of Central Arkansas

- The University of Central Arkansas was founded in 1907 in Conway, Arkansas.
- The 2014 fall enrollment included 11,698 students.
- UCA offers 83 undergraduate programs, 31 master's degrees, and 18 specialist and doctoral degrees.
- The most popular degrees at UCA include education, occupational therapy, and physical therapy.
- Their mascot is a bear and they are members of the Southland Conference NCAA Division I.
- Famous alumni of University of Central Arkansas:
 - Scottie Pippen, former NBA player
 - Kris Allen, American Idol winner



Arkansas State University



- Arkansas State University was founded in 1909 in Jonesboro, Arkansas.
- ASU's 2015 fall enrollment was 13,410 students.
- Their mascot is the Red Wolves, and they are members of the Sun Belt Conference NCAA Division I.
- Famous graduates of ASU:
 - Corey Williams, NFL player
 - Mike Beebe, former governor of Arkansas.



Ouachita Baptist University

- Ouachita Baptist University was established in 1886 in Arkadelphia, Arkansas.
- OBU has 1,543 students currently enrolled.
- They offer 47 undergraduate programs.
- The OBU mascot is a tiger and they are members of the Great American Conference NCAA Division II.
- Famous graduates of Ouachita Baptist University include:
 - Mike Huckabee, former governor of Arkansas and 2016 Presidential candidate
 - Phillip Supernaw, NFL Player



Henderson State University

- Henderson State University was founded in 1908 in Arkadelphia, Arkansas.
- There are currently 3,230 students enrolled at Henderson State.
- Henderson State offers 40 undergraduate programs and 11 graduate programs.
- They are very popular for their liberal arts and science majors.
- The mascot of Henderson State is a Reddie and they are members of the Great American Conference NCAA Division II.
